51 only two voices in English, but THREE in Greek!

- **52** middle is subjacting "with reference to" himself. Either 1) directly ON himself, or 2) FOR himself. Exact meaning depends on defn of verb, and context. Sometimes untranslateable.
- **53** conjugation of middle, $\lambda o \psi o \mu \alpha \iota$ / note diff. betw direct and indirect meanings (contrast $\lambda o \upsilon o \mu \alpha \iota$, I wash MYSELF, and ἀγοράζομαι, I buy FOR myself)
- marginote tenses whose passive voice is different than the middle: future, future perfect, 1 & 2 aorist
 - **54** endings of middle: $-\mu\alpha\iota$, $-\sigma\alpha\iota$, $-\tau\alpha\iota$, $-\mu\epsilon\theta\alpha$, $-\sigma\theta\epsilon$, - $\nu \tau \alpha \iota$ (only $-\sigma \alpha \iota$ changes to $-\eta$ through contraction)
